Experience

- In the United States District Court, Eastern District of Texas, represented an automotive wheel company in claims of patent infringement. Secured full dismissal of claims based upon invalidity of the patent.
- In the United States District Court, Eastern District of Texas, represented a global software company in claims of patent infringement by non-practicing entity and obtained dismissal of claims following an Alice motion.
- In the United States District Court, Central District of California, represented a promotional products company in patent infringement claims against alleged infringers resulting in recovery of damages.
- In California State Court, represented a major bank in breach of contract, business torts, and unfair competition claims from a collection agency. Secured summary judgment in favor of the bank on all claims and prevailed in the subsequent appeal before the California Court of Appeals.
